Senator Landrieu opposes a public health insurance option. We need her on our side.

Over the next decade, average health insurance premiums for Louisiana families are expected to skyrocket by more than \$8,000.¹ Our state can't afford the status quo—but Senator Landrieu *opposes* giving Louisianans the choice of a strong public health insurance option.²


A public option means affordable health coverage for Louisianans.

The choice of a public health insurance option would make health coverage affordable and accessible to more Louisianans. Senate legislation that includes a public health insurance option would save the typical Louisiana family \$3,859 compared to legislation without a public option.³ Another analysis found that legislation with a strong public option would cover about 679,000 Louisianans who currently lack coverage.⁴ So, why is Senator Landrieu standing in the way?

Senator Landrieu accepted over \$550,000 from insurance and HMO interests.

Over the course of her career in Washington, Senator Landrieu has accepted more than \$550,000 in campaign cash from insurance and health special interests that oppose real reform with a public option.⁵ Maybe that's why she opposes giving Louisianans a choice of a public option?
